“New Group Program Information Part 2”

Arrest Information Resource “A.I.R.”

The Arrest Information Resource (A.I.R.) Program, which is an enhanced computer based program utilizing the latest technology, allows each active Neighborhood Watch Group within the City of Syracuse the opportunity to receive notifications when criminal activity occurs within their “Target Area”. A group’s Target Area is defined by the streets or boundaries covered by an individual Neighborhood Watch Group.

How It Works:

- Each Neighborhood Watch Group will submit a list of streets or boundaries for their organization known as their “Target Area”. This information can be updated at any time.
- Each Neighborhood Watch Group will designate a Director and/or Co-Directors to be the contacts for their organization. These individuals should have email access and reside within the area they represent.
- As crime related information becomes available it is entered into the NWGS A.I.R. database. This information is sorted and emailed to Neighborhood Watch Directors based on their “Target Area”.

Neighborhood Watch - Watch Districts

- To enhance communication within our organization, Neighborhood Watch Groups of Syracuse implemented Neighborhood Watch “Watch Districts”. These meetings offer Neighborhood Watch members the opportunity to come together so they can learn about crime related information, programs, and initiatives being offered in their community. Watch District meetings have been established in the North, Southwest, and Southeast Districts so they are aligned with the Syracuse Police Department.
- Watch District meetings will be convened as needed by the Neighborhood Watch Groups of Syracuse Program Coordinator. These meetings have proven to be a valuable resource as we continue to expand the number of active groups operating within the City of Syracuse.
