Safety Tip:

Preparing for Halloween and Trick-or-Treaters can make it a safe night for everyone.

Halloween Safety Tips for Homeowners

- > Clear yards and walkways of items that can be tripped over.
- Pets get frightened on Halloween so keep them inside to protect them from cars and Trick-or-Treaters. Standing at the front door eliminates the need for Trick-or-Treaters to ring your doorbell which often scares pets.
- Battery powered pumpkins are preferable. If you use candles, place them far away from where Trick-or-Treaters will be.
- > If possible park vehicles in your garage, backyard, or driveway, not on the street.
- If you will be going out for the evening be sure to turn off porch/front door lights before leaving. This indicates you're not giving out candy.
- If you will not be home be sure to lock first floor windows, close drapes and blinds, and turn on a few second floor interior lights.
- > Do Not Let Anyone In Your Home You Don't Know, No Exceptions!
- Recommended times for candy distribution is between the hours of 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. These are suggested times, the final decision is up to the homeowner.

Halloween Safety Tips for Parents

- Adults should accompany young children from house to house.
- > Costumes should be flame-retardant with reflective markings.
- > Older children should know where to reach you and when to be home.
- Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring candy home to be inspected before eating it. This helps children who may have food allergies.

Halloween Safety Tips for Trick-or-Treaters:

- Carry a flashlight or glow stick.
- > Don't go out alone, use the buddy system.
- ▶ Walk on the sidewalk not in the road and obey traffic signals.
- Stay in familiar neighborhoods.
- > Do Not wear masks while walking from house to house. If possible wear makeup.
- > Approach only houses with front porch/door lights on.
- Stay away from pets you don't know.
- > <u>**Do Not</u>** approach cars with strangers.</u>
